Summer Scrip Order Dates

CAS will be ordering scrip **one Wednesday a month** this summer. The dates will be **Wednesday, June 14th, and July 12th**. Beginning **August 16th** we will be ordering every Wednesday. Scrip is a term that means "substitute money". When parents purchase scrip, they're purchasing negotiable gift certificates that are used just like cash. CAS families can use scrip to purchase everyday expenses like gasoline, clothing, and other essentials, and with every purchase, they earn revenue for tuition. Order forms are located in the informational rack.

Important Deadlines Regarding End of Year Fees

Today is the deadline for all outstanding fees to be settled. This includes tuition, lunch accounts, volunteer hours, Eagles Nest, sports fees, library fees (also returning late or missing books), etc. If an outstanding balance remains after **today**, RenWeb will be disabled until all fees are paid.

Message from Board of Health

Immunization Requirement for 7th Grade Entry

One (1) dose of TDAP and Meningococcal vaccines **MUST** be administered PRIOR to entry into 7th Grade
Tetanus-Diphtheria-acellular Pertussis (whooping cough)

Tdap can be given regardless of interval since the last tetanus-or diphtheria-toxoid containing vaccine
Meningococcal (MCV4 – serogroup, A, C, W, and Y)

Immunization Requirement for 12th Grade Entry

All students entering the 12th grade **ARE REQUIRED** to be vaccinated against meningococcal (serogroups A, C, W, and Y) disease. If the first dose was received prior to the age of 16, a second dose of meningococcal vaccine **is required**. The second dose must be administered on or after the 16th birthday with at least eight weeks between the first and second dose. If the first dose of meningococcal vaccine was administered after the 16th birthday, a second dose is **not required**.

A waiver is available if your child is exempt from shots. See Mrs. Purple
