Nutritious Lunches at CAS

Kindergarten – 6th grades: \$3 7th – 12 grades: \$3.25 Extras: Main Entrée: \$1.25 ea. Extra Side: .75 ea. Extra Drink: .75 ea.

Families have *pre-paid* lunch accounts in which parents may put any amount of money. Students can stop by the office and pay for their lunches in the mornings before school begins. The cost of whatever (lunch, entrees, or drink) the student buys is then deducted from their account during lunchtime. **Parents may check with the office or RenWeb for account balances**. Milk or water may be purchased as well. We encourage all students to eat a nutritious lunch.

Parents, We Need Your Help

Between the hours of 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. it is **VERY** important that parents, grandparents, and all visitors sign in and sign out at the front desk when entering the building. Even though teachers and staff may recognize the guest(s) it is crucial that you wear a visitor's pass. This is for the safety of your child(ren). Thank you for your cooperation.

Wednesday Recess Request

On chapel days, elementary students can bring tennis shoes to change into for recess, so they are not wearing their good shoes. Girls can wear shorts under their dress during recess too. Now that the weather is getting cooler please bring a jacket for your child. They will be going outside for recess and enjoying the fall weather.

If Your Child has Transportation Changes...

The office would appreciate parents who need to make transportation changes (for example: your student will be picked up instead of riding the bus home) to call **no later than 2 p.m.** This is the best way to guarantee that your child receives the message of the transportation change. Waiting to call near the end of the day makes it difficult to relay the message to your child.

After School Care Available

After school care is available at Christian Academy Schools. The cost is \$5 per hour and \$2.50 for a half hour or less. All children MUST be picked up no later than 5:30 p.m. every day. Parents are to send a note or call the school no later than noon if your child is planning to stay after school and say what time they are being picked up.

Scrip Helps with Tuition

How does Script work?

- 1. Family and friends can buy gift cards and every gift card purchased families will get a percentage back that will go toward their tuition.
- 2. CAS takes 1% on cards ordered to cover shipping costs.
- 3. GLScrip takes .26% for Ohio sales tax.
- 4. List of cards available and their percentages are listed at www.glscrip.com. Click on "Retailer List" at top left portion of screen.
- 5. Retailers change occasionally with new ones being added and some removed. Sometimes they have a special higher percent return for a designated period of time.

We will be sending a scrip gift card order in every **Wednesday**. Orders need to be turned in by **8:30 a.m**. and *will be available the following Wednesday by 12 p.m*. National and local retailers issue the scrip gift cards. These merchants want to support non-profit organizations, and in return ask you to support them by shopping with scrip at their stores. CAS families can use scrip to purchase everyday expenses like gasoline, clothing, and other essentials. With every purchase, you <u>earn revenue for tuition</u>. Order forms can be obtained in the informational rack. Attached to the newsletter is more information scrip and a sample of the order form.

Kroger Rewards Program

Kroger offers a "Community Rewards Program" where you can earn money to go toward your tuition based upon your purchases at Kroger's. You can sign up online and assign your Kroger Plus Card to Christian Academy. The rewards earned will be based on a percentage of spending as it relates to the total spending of all participating in the Kroger Community Reward organizations. Kroger's sends a check to CAS on a quarterly basis.
