

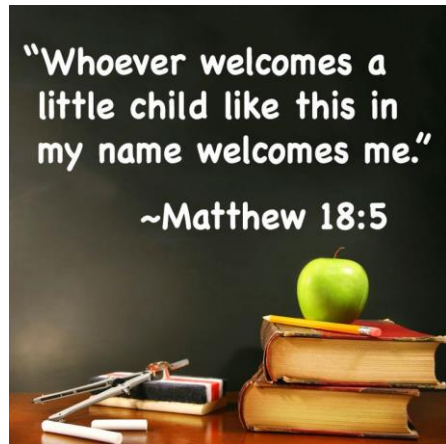

Parents Can Access ParentsWeb Features

Parents can now access ParentsWeb features and functions from a desktop or laptop computer, tablet, or preferred mobile device (without having to purchase the Home app). Switching to the new ParentsWeb design is easy, too! Simply choose ParentsWeb Configuration from the main menu in FACTS SIS and select the Branded ParentsWeb Configuration button. Then apply the “Responsive (All devices, mobile-friendly)” layout. You can also preview the change before applying, if you wish. Walk for the King

We finally made it to the Cleveland Metroparks Zoo! This zoo is known to have one of the largest collections of **primates** in various biome sections. Besides walking to these sections, we can choose to ride the two "ZooTram" lines which shuttle visitors between areas within the zoo. The RainForest biome greets us with a cascading, 25-foot waterfall and a large tropical garden that soars up two stories. The two-story building contains rain forest animals. The RainForest area also features animals in an outer ring, while the inner ring houses tropical plants with small mammals, cafeteria, and gift shop.

The elusive and endangered black rhino exhibit is located in the African Savanna biome. We can see Zuri, an eleven-year-old rhino who was born at the zoo. Nearby is Monkey Island, where many colobus monkeys run free delighting young and old alike. The Australian Adventure biome is designed to resemble an **Australian outback**. It is home to **wallaroos, kangaroos, and wallabies** that roam freely throughout Wallaby Walkabout. We can learn how to shear sheep at Kookaburra Station. We now turn south heading toward our third and unique zoo in Ohio.

Ohio St. If the child needs follow-up treatment, the local dentists have agreed to provide treatment for the next 6 months at NO CHARGE.
