Congratulations to the Track & Field Team

Riverside Invitational in DeGraff on Friday 04/05/19: Those receiving medals for placing in the top three: Cierra Miller received the Gold Metal by winning 1st in the Discus with a new school record at 104'08". She also took the Silver Medal by getting 2nd in the 100M Dash. Hannah Heaberlin took Silver in High Jump by getting 2nd place. Josiah Condon received the Bronze Medal by placing 3rd in 200M Dash. There were other places achieved for points also; Hannah & Josiah were both 5th in Long Jump, as well as Cierra in the 200M Dash, and 6th Place was accomplished by Taylor Hainline in Shot Put and Cierra in Long Jump.
