Thank you for your prayers and support of CAS during this 2018-19 school year. May is traditionally a very busy month and this year is no exception. Walk For the King

Participants have arrived in Powell, Ohio at our destination. Have you visited the Columbus Zoo? It is a popular destination and it is well known world-wide because of director emeritus <u>Jack Hanna</u>. The zoo houses and cares for over 800 species and 7,000 animals ranging from Asia Quest, Polar Frontier, North America, Congo Expedition, Shores and Aquarium, Australia and Islands and Heart of Africa exhibits. Even if you visited last summer, you will want to go again to see the January births of a Dama Gazelle and a Silvered Leaf Langur. Zoo visitors can meet the 2 month old puppies through the Winter at the Wilds Tours. Columbus has a strong conservation program directly supporting the Mexican Wolves and Manatees. In fact, two manatees named Millennium and Falcon, went back to Florida last September to return into the wild. In October, a polar bear named Lee, came to the Columbus Zoo because of its successful polar bear breeding program.
