In 1986, while president, he earned his doctorate in higher education from the University of Cincinnati. He also holds an honorary Doctor of Divinity degree from his alma mater, and the honorary Doctor of Laws degree from Liberty University in Lynchburg, Virginia. After 25 years as the Cedarville president, Dr. Dixon became the Chancellor of the University, as the mantle of the presidency was passed to William E. Brown.
