Sword in the Stars by Wayne Thomas Batson

Haunted by memories of a violent past, Alastair Coldhollow wagers his life on the hope that a sword will appear in the stars and the foretold Halfainin,the Pathwalker, would come. Meanwhile. tensions simmer between Anglinore and the murderous Gorrack Nation, threatening war on a cataclysmic scale. The fate of all could rest on an abandoned child and the decisions of those who desperately seek to identify him.

Sword in the Stars is the first release in The Myridian Constellation series (formerly called *The Dark Sea Annals* series). This series follows a noble king who discovers what happens when he leaves a door open for evil, and the disastrous consequences that could impact generations.

Written by a Christian author who is a middle school teacher, Wayne Thomas Batson, this is fantasy Christian fiction much like Lord of the Rings or C.S. Lewis' The Lion, The Witch and the Wardrobe. Action packed and written for ages 13 years and up, this series will keep you riveted and rooting for the main characters.
