

CAS Collects Plastic Bags

Did you know CAS has been collecting bags for 5 years? The bags are used to make mats for the homeless. The bags are used to make mats, pillows, backpacks, purses, water bottle holders, and market bags. It takes two weeks to make one mat and takes 500 to 700 bags to make one mat. The volunteers work 6-8 hours a day – 7 days a week. These mats are distributed locally and other area shelters. They can also use yarn to make hats and scarfs for the homeless and bears that go to children's hospitals. 
Verse of the Week
