From that height, the water flows down, then splits in the middle of the fall and reconnects before plummeting into a small pool of refreshing water. We are standing on a rocky beach at the bottom of the falls, enjoying the seclusion provided by the surrounding steep rock walls, hemlock trees and caves. Cedar Falls is the halfway point for the annual Hocking Hills Winter Hike that's held every January. Organizers provide hot navy bean soup, cornbread, and hot chocolate (for a donation). Park naturalists are available to answer questions, and there is usually music, and a festive environment, trekohio.com Other nearby waterfalls can be found at Ash Cave and Old Man's Cave.
