During the past few days while reading one of my many news and professional resources I came across an article that presented a view that possibly non-public schools are not held to as high a level of accountability as public schools are. I smiled as I read this knowing that in some ways our school here at Christian Academy is held to an extra set of standards as well as to the ultimate standard.

One thing some may not realize is that even in this current school year we are in the process for an accreditation renewal for two different accrediting agencies. This involves lots of extra evaluations of all areas of our school from multiple groups both inside and out of CAS. These are merely more in -depth evaluations than what we are required to do yearly.

We are also held to the standards set forth by the State of Ohio Department of Education. Any time that a non-public school such as ourselves receives funding from the State or Federal government we are required to submit the many reports back and to give an account of what we are doing.

Finally, we are held accountable at CAS to the ultimate standard as a Christian School as found in Colossians 3:23,24. This passage reads "Whatever you do, do your work heartily, as for the Lord rather than for men, knowing that from the Lord you will receive the reward of the inheritance. It is the Lord Christ whom you serve." We are and will be accountable to the One Who already knows everything and to Whom we owe everything.
