A study published in the *Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences of the United States of America* suggests that there are 27 basic emotions. The list is too long to print here, but it includes: amusement, anxiety, awe, boredom, calmness, disgust, envy, excitement, fear, horror, sadness, and sympathy.

Our emotions can overwhelm us, but we shouldn't let them overwhelm the truth of God. When you experience fear, sadness, anxiety, or confusion, turn your attention to the Word of God. There are two chapters in the Bible, Deuteronomy 31, and Joshua 1, in which the Lord tells us again and again: "I will never leave you nor forsake you."

These are good chapters to read when your emotions are giving you trouble. Listen to your Father more than your feelings!

Free Lunch and Breakfast for all CAS Students

Ohio Department of Education has approved the Seamless Summer Option (SSO) extension for food services. This means all students at Christian Academy Schools will receive free breakfast and lunch meals through December 31, 2020. All students will receive a free regular breakfast and/or lunch. Any additional items, extra meal items, or extra milks will have to be paid for by the student. Any student who may qualify for free or reduced meals should still complete the Free/Reduced Meal application paper copy from the school. Starting January 1, 2021, the Seamless Summer Option (SSO) will expire and students will return to full pay status unless they have completed and qualify for free or reduced meals.
