The 2021 Homecoming event is open to 6th – 12th grade CAS students and a guest. - **Saturday, January 23rd** – Night on the Red Carpet from 6 p.m. - 8 p.m.

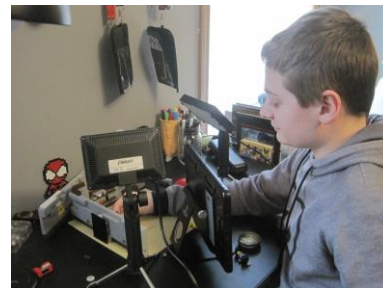
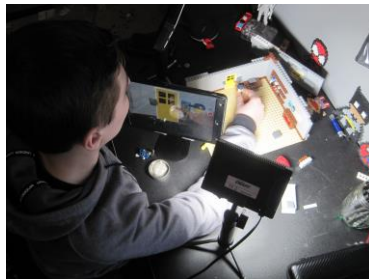
Christian Academy to Host a Blood Drive
