#### **CAS Refer a Friend**

PARENTS of presently enrolled students can have \$250 toward their school bill. This will be granted when the new student has been enrolled for 1 semester and is in good standing on their bill. (Example – if a CAS parent who presently has a child in K-12 refers a family with two children enrolling in CAS, that parent would receive a tuition discount of \$500 as long as the referred students remain enrolled for 1 semester). Only one referring family can be cited by a prospective family. Parents who are already receiving scholarships for tuition will be able to apply towards book fees or their family service hours. There is no cash value with this program. The amount applied to the family's account can not exceed their balance. So... tell your family and friends about CAS!

#### Christian Academy Parent Teacher Conferences NEXT WEEK

Middle School and High School Conferences will be by appointment only during the days of Tuesday, February 23<sup>rd</sup> - Thursday, February 25<sup>th</sup>. If you would like to meet with a teacher, to discuss your student's performance, please call the school at 937-492-7556 and ask for an appointment. The appointments can be done by phone, in person or by Zoom. If your student has a grade lower than a 70, the teacher will be contacting the parent to set up an appointment.

Elementary Parent Teacher Conferences for parents of kindergarten thru 5<sup>th</sup> grades will be during the week of February 22<sup>nd</sup> to February 26<sup>th</sup>. Parents can request a conference if they feel it is needed. Teachers will be contacting the parents to schedule appointments they deem necessary. Due to Covid, we are asking that only 1 person attend conferences (no children) and you must wear a facial covering. If you do not feel comfortable coming to the school, we can do a phone conference or a virtual conference as well.

### Math Olympics - Friday, February 26th

We are proud to announce those students from our school, in grades 3-8, who have qualified to participate in our regional ACSI Math Olympics. Each student will be competing against other students in his/her grade level and category (arithmetic computation or mathematical reasoning) in other ACSI schools in our region.

This event will be conducted remotely. The Math Olympics is a series of timed tests given in a series of rounds. Ribbons are awarded to the top five places in each grade level and category for our region. The region's first place student in each grade level and category with a score of 85% or higher is also awarded an Olympic-style medallion.
