Fake vs. Truth

Each day, I along with so many Christians including those of us in the Christian Education world are faced with distinguishing between what is fake and what is true or truth. In discussions daily here at CAS with students and staff I realize our students are faced with the same matters. Sadly, students at times may not even realize what they are doing or believing is actually fake but because what is shared via social media and other media outlets, they think it must be true.

On an ongoing basis we have various matters or policies that are coming our way from political groups that would regard matters that we as Christians would hold to not be true. Daily there is legislation being discussed and voted upon that would be presented as bringing let's say "equality" but in truth is really detrimental to Christian views and organizations.

What is truth or true is not necessarily something that is new today in our current culture. Even in Jesus' day recorded in the Book of John, Pilate asked Jesus "What is truth" in John 18:38. Re-enroll Your Child(ren) for 2021-22 School Year

Parents can now re-enroll their student(s) for the 21-22 school year! The cost to re-enroll is \$25 for one child and \$40 for a family with two or more children who are *currently* enrolled at CAS. After **March 31**^{st,} the cost will be \$100 to re-enroll per family. By re-enrolling you are reserving a spot for your child for the 2021-22 school year. If you have any questions, please call 492-7556.

CAS Refer a Friend

PARENTS of presently enrolled students can have \$250 toward their school bill. This will be granted when the new student has been enrolled for 1 semester and is in good standing on their bill. (Example – if a CAS parent who presently has a child in K-12 refers a family with two children enrolling in CAS, that parent would receive a tuition discount of \$500 as long as the referred students remain enrolled for 1 semester). Only one referring family can be cited by a prospective family. Parents who are already receiving scholarships for tuition will be able to apply towards book fees or their family service hours. There is no cash value with this program. The amount applied to the family's account cannot exceed their balance. So... tell your family and friends about CAS!

biology major at THE Ohio State.


