March is Re-enrollment Month for the 2021-22 School Year

March is re-enrollment month here at CAS. As God leads you to continue your child's education with Christian Academy in the 2021-2022 school year, we want to help you in that process. The re-enrollment fee is \$25 per student or \$40 per family when you re-enroll your student(s) by March 31st. After March 31, 2021, the re-enrollment fee increases to \$100. **All that is necessary from you is to fill out the information on the form in the email that was sent or request a form be sent home with your child and return with your payment to the front desk by March 31st.** You can also call or email the school to let us know you would like to re-enroll your student and send the payment in. It's that simple!!

CAS Refer a Friend

PARENTS of presently enrolled students can have \$250 toward their school bill. This will be granted when the new student has been enrolled for 1 semester and is in good standing on their bill. (Example – if a CAS parent who presently has a child in K-12 refers a family with two children enrolling in CAS, that parent would receive a tuition discount of \$500 as long as the referred students remain enrolled for 1 semester). Only one referring family can be cited by a prospective family. Parents who are already receiving scholarships for tuition will be able to apply towards book fees or their family service hours. There is no cash value with this program. The amount applied to the family's account cannot exceed their balance. So... tell your family and friends about CAS!

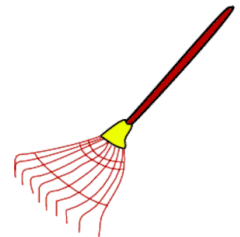
You will be working outdoors so dress according to weather.

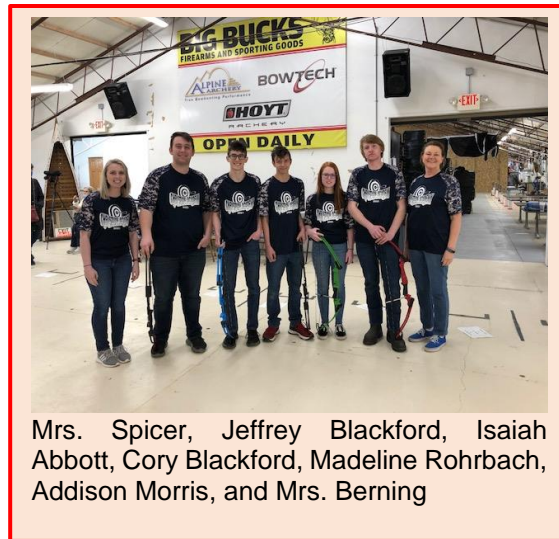
