Immunization Requirement for 7th Grade Entry

One (1) dose of TDAP and Meningococcal vaccines **ARE REQUIRED to** be administered PRIOR to entry into 7th grade. Tetanus-Diphtheria-acellular Pertussis (whooping cough) Tdap can be given regardless of interval since the last tetanus-or diphtheria-toxoid containing vaccine. Meningococcal (MCV4 – serogroup, A, C, W, and Y)

Immunization Requirement for 12th Grade Entry

All students entering the 12th grade **ARE REQUIRED** to be vaccinated against meningococcal (serogroups A, C, W, and Y) disease. If the first dose was received prior to the age of 16, a second dose of meningococcal vaccine <u>is required</u>. The second dose must be administered on or after the 16th birthday with at last eight weeks between the first and second dose. If the first dose of meningococcal vaccine was administered after the 16th birthday, a second dose is <u>not required</u>. *An immunization waiver* is available if your child is exempt from shots. Please send document of required vaccination to the school office when completed.
