Students Visit Vietnam Wall

Students in grades 8-12 visited the traveling Vietnam Wall Memorial on September 17th at Custenborder field. The students participated in a district-wide student event in which high schoolers were invited to see the 3/5 scale replica of the Vietnam Wall located in Washington D.C. They also heard from Col. Taylor, an author, historian, and publisher, who served for four years in Vietnam. After, they heard from Chief Master Sergeant O'Meara survived two deployments to Iraq in 2003 and 2004.

Students then entered the field of 1,000 crosses which stood to represent the 8,000 US service members that have perished from 1975 to the present. They met with several Vietnam veterans to interview them and learn from their experiences during the war. The students had an excellent time learning about our nation's history as well as appreciating those who have given their lives for our freedom.
