## From the Desk of Head of School




#### **A Great Work**

That was great news, but we knew that recommendation still then needed to be forwarded on and approved by the ACSI East Accreditation Commission for the Central US.

In the past couple of weeks, we received official word that we have been renewed for dual accreditation with ACSI and Cognia.
