Yesterday afternoon I enjoyed going with a few of our students to nearby Dorothy Love Assisted Living where a traveling display entitled "Goliath's Spear" was on display. Ellie Toms, Becca Keller and Peyton Smith are pictured here showing both how large the spear would have been at over 12 feet long weighing over 33 lbs . as well as how large Goliath would have been at over nine feet tall with the area on his forehead that David would have to have hit at only an area of four inches in diameter. Seeing this in perspective helped to even more make us realize the incredible act that God performed through David in 1 Samuel 17.

David even before his encounter with Goliath indicated in verse 45 that he came in the name of the Lord of hosts, the God of the armies of Israel, whom Goliath was taunting. God would be the source of victory for David through the words shared. During and after the encounter David had with Goliath the actions would show that God was the source of victory. When David's stone hit the mark on the giant's forehead amazingly Goliath fell forward as noted in verse 49 and not backwards as would be expected from the blow from the stone on his forehead.

It can be easy at times when encountering great things that God has done to want to try and directly or indirectly take the credit for what God has accomplished. God's guiding Spirit in the writing of this great historical event in 1 Samuel 17 made it clear God was and is to be praised. What a wonderful reminder for us all to keep in mind.
