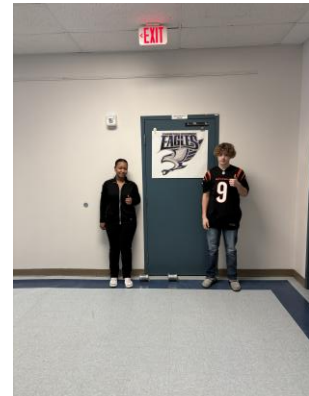


Our food service staff are so happy with our new convection oven. With a kind donation we were able to replace our 42-year-old unit. Praise the Lord.
