Standardized Testing Time for ALL Grades April 6 – thru April 17

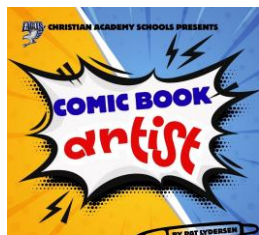


Junior & Senior Night

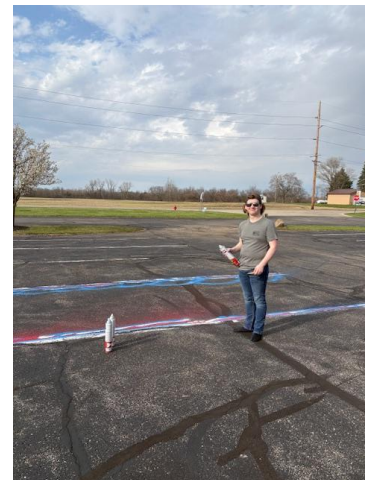
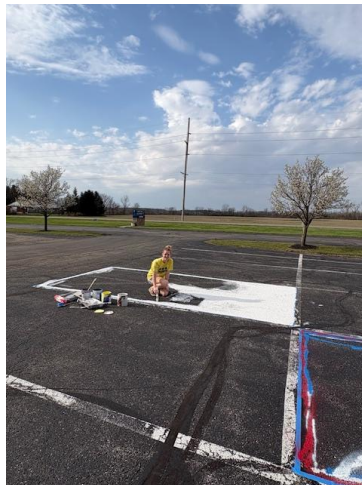
Creating Memories at CAS
